Uniform

The UTC Leeds uniform policy is designed to support a purposeful and safe working atmosphere. We have aimed to make our uniform smart, sensible and comfortable to support you with preparing for the world of work.

For all students:

- Long hair must be worn off the face and tied back in practical lessons for health and safety reasons.
- Makeup should be subtle.
- Jewellery should be limited to one set of simple studs per ear.
- School bags should be rucksack or messenger style bags.



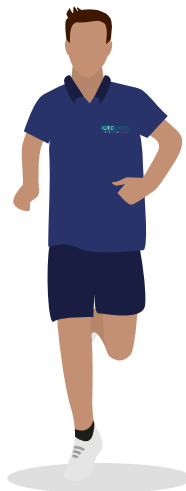
KS4:

- Tailored trousers (no leggings or jogging bottoms)
- UTC Leeds branded navy blue shirt.
- UTC Leeds branded zip top
- Formal, black leather full shoe with black laces (no trainers, boots, stiletto heels, open shoes or pumps).
- Plain black or navy socks.
- Belts must be leather with a plain buckle.
- Any clothing worn under shirts must not be visible.
- Coats are not permitted to be worn inside the college building.



A full PE kit must be worn by all Y10 & 11 students when taking part in any sporting activities:

- UTC Leeds branded PE polo top
- White or black crew socks
- Trainers
- Shorts or tracksuit bottoms
 - Navy or black shorts or tracksuit bottoms.
 - No combat style bottoms or shorts.
 - No branding or one small logo.



Branded uniform is available from our school supplier, Whittakers.

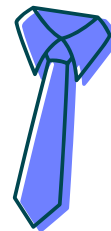

Sixth Form

A casual dress code is permitted in the sixth form. Some examples:

- Jeans, trainers and hooded sweatshirts are all allowed.
- No ripped jeans, crop tops, joggers or leggings.
- Coats are not permitted to be worn inside the college building.
- All KS5 students must wear a UTC lanyard and badge at all times unless in the workshop.
- Footwear should be appropriate for a lab or workshop (no sliders, open toe shoes etc)



Equipment

You should ensure that you always bring the following equipment to the UTC.

Useful Info for KS4:

- All KS4 students will leave their bags and coat in their assigned locker throughout the day.
- Students must provide their own lock for their locker.
- KS4 students will be provided with a UTC branded pack to carry around their equipment.

Catering

The canteen at UTC Leeds opens an 8:00am for breakfasts and is available at both morning break and lunchtime.

All Street Feast, Curry and Pasta Pot options come with a set side dish, such as: chips, homemade wedges, garlic bread, rice and naan, vegetable selection and gravy etc.

Please note: any paninis which are not on the menu are available as a preorder (to be ordered before the end of break, ready for lunch).

The canteen caters for all dietary requirements. Students should notify staff of any food allergies as soon as possible, well in advance of your induction day / first day at college

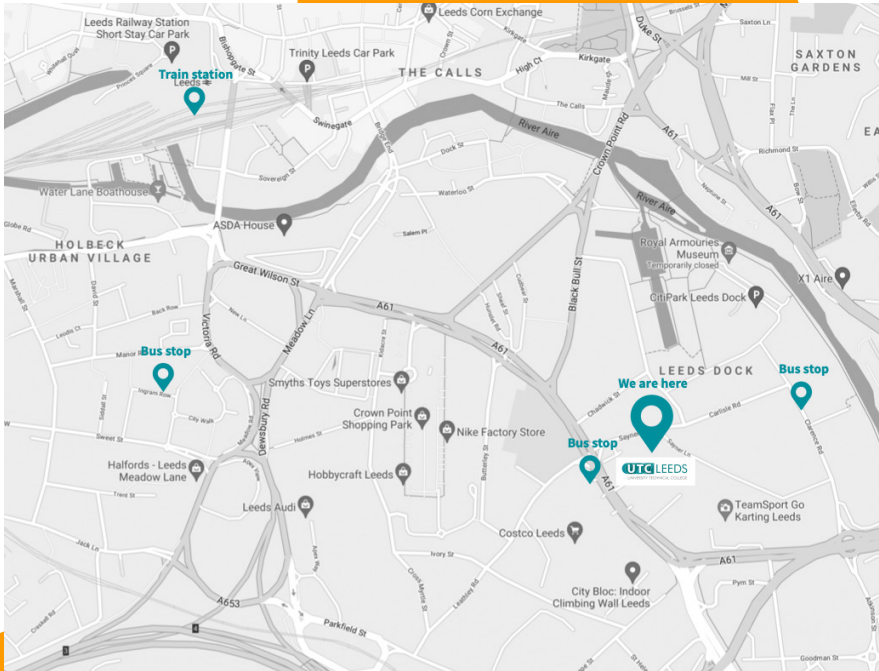
