



- Understanding British values of democracy and individual liberty
- Promoting engagement with British values
- Building knowledge of the rule of law and recognising the difference between right and wrong
- Engaging with modern society and appreciating the cultural influences within society in order to promote tolerance
- Reflecting on the consequences of actions and the impact on others
- Becoming members of society, being able to resolve conflict
- Building knowledge about the roles played by public institutions and voluntary groups in British society

- Understanding how to stay safe in different situations and settings, including on-line, fire and road safety.
- Making informed choices about a wide range of activities that impact health and well-being: including diet, fitness, drugs, alcohol and smoking.
- Emotional and mental well-being and managing stress
- Understanding healthy relationships at all ages
- Understanding the importance of attendance

- Enabling informed career choices - providing guidance on progression and future opportunities
- Developing skills and qualities, such as grit and determination. Instilling resilience and tenacity in pupils
- Managing money and understanding finance and debt
- Preparing for higher education, including developing study skills and revision techniques
- Reflecting on behaviours and attitudes to learning and working

- Developing self-worth, resilience and independence
- Developing confident learners. Encouraging students to think about their own learning
- Valuing diversity, promoting tolerance and tackling prejudice
- Encouraging self-reflection and valuing the beliefs (religious or otherwise) of others
- Showing respect for others by working and socialising with other pupils
- Working to prevent bullying
- Willingness to participate positively in artistic, musical, sporting and cultural opportunities
- Taking pride in personal achievements and in achievements of others in the school

- Considering the role of individuals within the global community
- Understanding the impact of human activities on the environment, sustainability and resources
- Building knowledge about the role of international organisations and voluntary groups
- Discussions and debates on global issues and current affairs, such as the global economy, global conflict and world health issues
- Developing respect for different cultures, religions and viewpoints and engaging in constructive debate
